I. Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 6:32 pm by Augustin.

- II. Approval of Agenda motioned by Marsh and seconded by Kuhn. All yes, motion passed.
- III. Community Opportunity to Address the Board: The Friends of the Library box has been returned. The PO box key was not returned and is assumed to be lost. The post office changes the lock when a PO box changes customers.
- IV. Approval of March 2022 Regular Meeting Minutes motioned by Augustin and seconded by Lefevre. All yes, motion passed.
- V. Financial Reports for March 2022
 - a. Supplies are being purchased for summer reading. There is now a new interior return bin by the side door. The accounting expense includes the cost of the audit, which is approximately \$4500 each year. The work on the porch is planned to start mid to late June.
 - b. Credit Card Detail Report was reviewed.
 - c. YTD Budget vs. Actuals was reviewed.
 - d. United Bank accounts were reviewed.
 - e. Approval of paid bills motioned by Byville and seconded by Fryling. All yes, motion passed.

VI. Director's Report

a. The official census data puts Henika District Library at 10th highest for population growth in the entire cooperative. Our population grew by about 12% (almost 1000 new residents). If the Yankee Springs ballot measure passes to add the residents of Yankee Springs Township who live in the Wayland Union School District, Henika will probably move up a library class size in the next year or two.

- b. Monthly Statistics were reviewed.
- c. The Youth Services report was reviewed. Becky is coordinating with local schools and other area libraries to coordinate events and library visits.
- d. The Adult Services report was reviewed. The seed library has been very popular. The seed holder is a card catalog, original to Henika District Library, that Faith refinished.
- e. The Circulation report was reviewed. Circulation continues to improve. Computer sessions and board game usage have increased.

i. The Allegan County Library Association offers a training opportunity for Allegan County libraries and staff approximately every three years. Training will include topics such as programming, circulation, customer services, and more. Bakovka has been asked to run a focus group on programming, and Henika is being used as an example on Special Collections. This is an inexpensive professional development opportunity (no cost aside from paying lunch for our staff) and would require the library to close for the day. All employees except Ashley would attend. Lefevre motioned to approve closing Henika District Library on October 10, 2022 to allow the staff to attend the ACLA training day. Seconded by Augustin. All yes, motion approved.

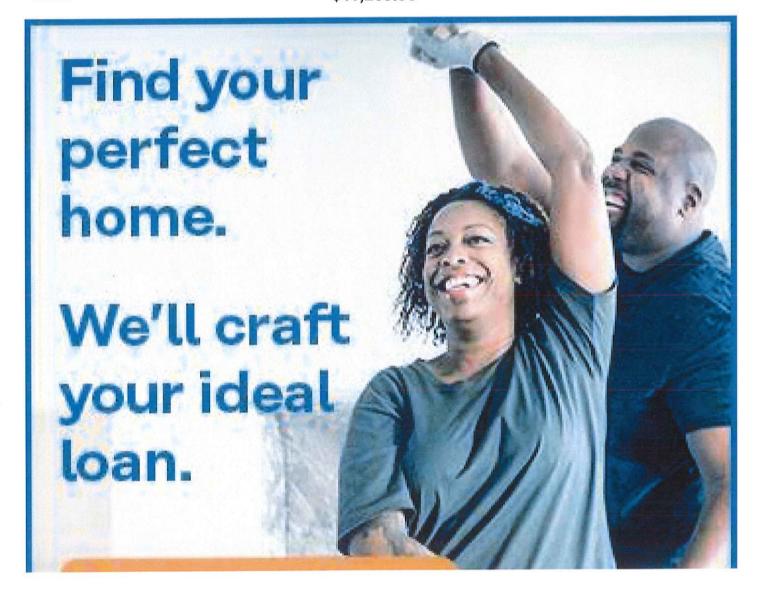

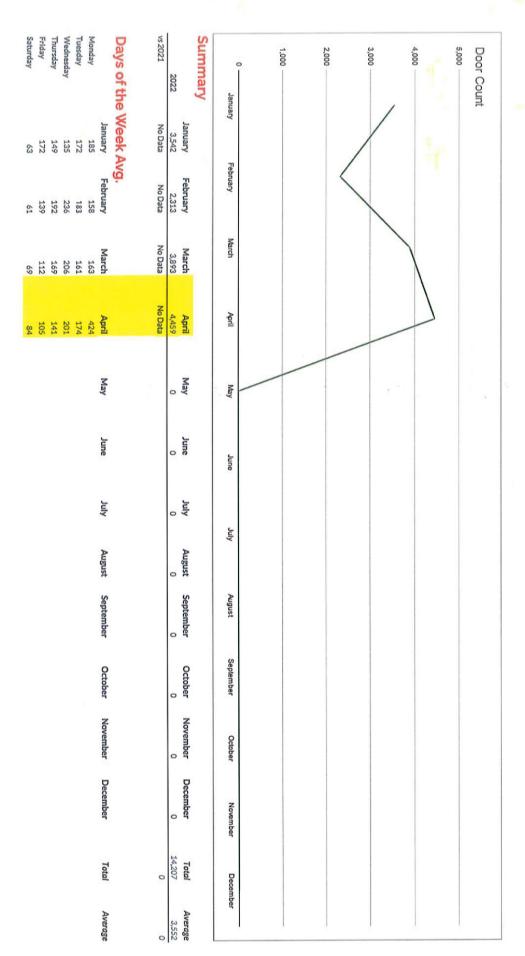

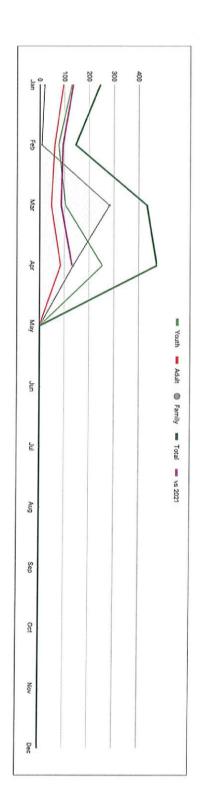

April 2022 Youth Services Report Becky Butler, Youth Services Librarian

Spring break! School visits have started again! Wahoo!

Storytime (ages 0-5): 16 people over 3 storytimes. We had a guest from a credit union for a special money-themed storytime because of our partnership with the \$mart Money: MI Kids Read program.

Family Fun (all ages): 7 people attended the Costuming event on the 16th. I had 15 people registered – only one family who pre-registered came. I think this is likely a result of having to shut down for a couple days immediately before the event.

After-School Art (ages 8-18ish): 70 attendees over 4 weeks. We made stained glass jars (a couple times since kids missed out on it over spring break), colored scales for my giant Rainbow Fish, made unicorn headbands and dragon masks, and made paper suncatchers.

Take-and-Makes: Fun with Fake Money (25 taken) and Velvet Coloring (18 taken). The Fun with Fake Money kit contained a book that was donated by the \$mart Money: MI Kids Read program. It proved popular!

Henika Pokemon Trainers: 7 attendees for our fourth monthly event. We traded cards and made perler bead Pokeballs.

LEGO Club: 23 attendees. We made a LEGO tower that touched the ceiling!

STEM Club: Not held as we were closed due to illnesses. I'm bummed to have to keep skipping or rescheduling this!

So You Want to Play D&D?: 4 attendees! My first teen event that had attendees! We created a couple characters, then one of the teens offered to lead us through a short adventure. The parents cut us off after playing for 2.5 hours. I took down the teens' contact info because I think they would enjoy a similar event with a guest DM so everyone can play next time.

Cupcake Wars: 26 attendees! Kids decorated cupcakes and then voted on the cutest, the most creative, and the spookiest designs. Good fun!

Real Life Among Us: 19 attendees scrambled around the library performing tasks and killing each other. Everyone had fun, but I'll definitely ask for back-up next time – this was a tough event to run on my own.

Encanto Singalong: 13 attendees. I think in future, I'll hold outdoor movie events and look into finding some interactive movie experiences (think Rocky Horror Picture Show but for children).

Other activities: St. Therese started making regular visits to the library. All classes will come every two weeks. We saw a little surge of parents renewing old cards to accommodate their kids' visits as a result. I plan to visit Pine Street classes during their media classes throughout May to promote the summer reading program (I'm working with Jill Terrell, the literacy coach over there). We had two classes of preschoolers from Baker visit the library on the 27th for a craft and to enjoy the Storywalk. I'll spend a morning over in Baker on May 23rd reading to kids and promoting the summer reading program. I'm still working on getting a contact at Steeby, so if you know someone, please let me know!

Looking forward:

I'm attempting to schedule a few less events this next month so I can focus on school visits. Storytimes and After-School Art will be held on the usual schedule through May. We'll have a special Star Wars-themed After-School Art on May 4th (May the Fourth be with you!). I'll be hosting the Microgreens event May 2nd at 6pm. Kids will get to make a little character using microgreens. 2 more classes of preschoolers at Baker will visit May 18. Family Fun will be held May 28th at 11:30 (we're having a gardening event with seed planting and pot decorating). The Take-and-Make will be Bubble Painting. The Teen Take-and-Make will be Paint by Sticker.

STEM Club (ages 6-13) will (theoretically) be May 19th at 4:00 pm. We're going to be learning about physics in playgrounds. On May 17th at 4 pm, I'm hosting another Pokemon night (ages 8-18). Lego Club (6-18, but families with younger folks welcome) will meet May 24th at 4 pm. I'll be in Hawaii May 6-15. I'm off to find the sun!

Programs & Attendance

Bunny Wreaths (In-Person): 14

Bunny Wreaths went well, it was a little rocky at the start because some patrons started early and then my instructions got a little out of whack, but everyone ended up in the same place and their wreaths looked good! If I could redo something about this program it would be to add more color elements, but assembly and painting went well!

Kitten Cafe (In-Person/Family): 48

Patrons loved this program! It was a huge draw for families with younger children and it garnered a lot of interest in the Country Cat Lady Rescue. Kids read a book about cats to one of the cats and they got to learn how to handle animals gently and with respect during the program. If we did this again I believe it would be helpful to have a third person on staff as it had a high attendance and I was busy handling one of the cats while Bethany was the only one at the desk.

Green Acres: Fluffy Slime (In-Person): 8

For my first visit at Green Acres I think this went very well! The seniors were hesitant to touch/play with the slime at first, but by the end a couple of them asked me how to store it so they could play with it later! I also read some short stories from a Chicken Soup for the Soul book and explained some of the science behind non-Newtonian fluids like this slime and ooblek.

Sawmill Estates: DIY Stress Balls (In-Person): 2

My lowest attendance at Sawmill Estates for sure. I think it had a little bit to do with the later time as I visited at 2pm instead of 12pm or 1pm as I have done in the past. The seniors who did attend enjoyed this activity more than the crafts we've done in the past. They also play tested the balloon game I will be playing with them next month and told me they were looking forward to playing with a group!

Tiny Terrariums (In-Person): 13

I wish I had had more little jars so more people could attend, but this program was thought up to use some stragglers I had down in the basement to clear up space. I will definitely be running a similar program in the future, but most likely outside so I can have more attendees. We had a lot of people on the waitlist, so I'm confident I could have had a much larger turnout if I had had the supplies for it.

Parent's Only Club (In-Person): 0

The flop of the month. Unfortunately, no one showed for the Parent's Only Club to learn about kid friendly science experiments. I do have another planned for art skills in May, so I will see if that one gets any attendance. I have geared this towards families with younger children, so it is in the middle of the day which hasn't historically worked well with my other programs either.

Mixology 101 (In-Person): 5

This program is not going as well as I had hoped it would. I had thought that by eliminating the book club portion of this program we might see more attendees, but only Gary attended this event on purpose (thank you Gary!). My other attendees were patrons who happened to be in the library at the same time as the program and sampled the drink. Next month will be my last Mixology 101 (we will be making Frozen Strawberry Mockaritas) and then I may do a special mixology event in the future, but Mixology 101/Mocktails and Murder will no longer be a monthly event.

Seed Library (Passive): 25 people/140 Packets

The seed library is still doing amazing! So far we've had about half of our total seed packets have been "checked out" by patrons and we continue to hear praise for this program.

Stoned! A Crash Course in Crystal & Stone Healing (Virtual): 18

This was the best turnout we've had for a virtual program yet! We did not have anyone join to watch with us in the library, but patrons logging in from home were very engaged and participated in the Q&A at the end of the program. The presenters from Grounded Goodwife were great at holding their audience's attention and adding humor to their presentation. I would love to have them back again in the future.

Grow Your Own Geode (Take-&-Make): 25

I had more interest in Grow Your Own Geode than I thought I would and that's very exciting! This is the first time that everyone who registered picked up their kits on time and I did not have to place any extras on the display to get rid of them. It was very labor intensive on my end as I had to grow the seed crystals needed for the project kits, but it was a lot of fun and I'm excited to hear how it turned out for everyone!

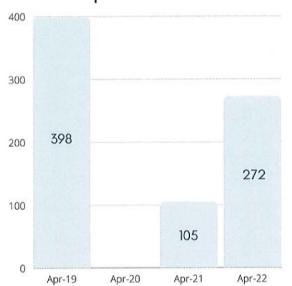

TKS does not provide Internet service, maintain Internet connection, wireless access or communication pathways, computer, smart phone, electric current connection or supply, or in all cases the remote video server. In consideration of Subscriber making its monthly payments for remote access to the system, TKS will authorize Subscriber access. TKS is not responsible for Subscriber's access to the Internet or any interruption of service or down time of remote access caused by loss of Internet service, radio or cellular or any either mode of communication used by Subscriber to access the system. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 14. DELAY IN DELIVERY / INSTALLATION / RISK OF LOSS OF MATERIAL: TKS shall not be liable for any damage or loss sustained by Subscriber as a result of delay in delivery and/or installation of equipment, equipment failure, or for interruption of service due to electric failure, strikes, walk-outs, war, acts of God, or other causes, including TKS' negligence or failure to perform any obligation. The estimated date work is to be substantially completed is not a definite completion date and time is not of the essence. In the event the work is delayed through no fault of TKS, TKS shall have such additional time for performance as may be reasonably necessary under the circumstances. Subscriber on its behalf and any insurance carrier waives any right of subrogation Subscriber's insurance carrier may otherwise have against TKS or TKS' subcontractors arising out of this agreement or the relation of the parties hereto. Subscriber shall not be permitted to assign this agreement without written consent of TKS, which shall not unreasonably be withheld. TKS shall have the right to assign this agreement to a company licensed to perform the services and shall be relieved of any obligations herein upon such assignment.
- 21. EXCULPATORY CLAUSE: TKS and Subscriber agree that TKS is not an insurer and no insurance coverage is offered herein. The security system, equipment, and TKS' services are designed to detect and reduce certain risks of loss, though TKS does not guarantee that no loss or damage will occur. TKS is not assuming liability, and, therefore, shall not be liable to Subscriber or any other third party for any loss, economic or non-economic, business loss or interruption, consequential damages, in contract or tort, data corruption or inability to retrieve data, personal injury or property damage sustained by Subscriber or others as a result of equipment failure, human error, burglary, theft, hold-up, fire, smoke, water or any other cause whatsoever, regardless of whether or not such loss or damage was caused by or contributed to by TKS' breach of contract, negligent performance to any degree in furtherance of this agreement, any extra contractual or legal duty, strict products liability, or negligent failure to perform any obligation pursuant to this agreement or any other legal duty, except for gross negligence and willful misconduct.
- 22. INSURANCE / ALLOCATION OF RISK: Subscriber shall maintain a policy of Comprehensive General Liability and Property Insurance for liability, casualty, fire, theft, and property damage under which Subscriber is named as insured and TKS is named as additional insured and which shall on a primary and non-contributing basis cover any loss or damage TKS' services are intended to detect to one hundred percent of the insurable value or potential risk. The parties intend that the Subscriber assume all potential risk and damage that may arise by reason of failure of the equipment, system or TKS' services and that Subscriber will look to its own insurance carrier for any loss or assume the risk of loss, TKS shall not be responsible for any portion of any loss or damage which is recovered or recoverable by Subscriber from insurance covering such loss or damage or for such loss or damage against which Subscriber is indemnified or insured. Subscriber and all those claiming rights under Subscriber waive all rights against TKS and its subcontractors for loss or damages caused by perils intended to be detected by TKS' services or covered by insurance to be obtained by Subscriber, except such rights as Subscriber or others may have to the proceeds of insurance.
- 23. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY: SUBSCRIBER AGREES THAT, EXCEPT FOR TKS' GROSS NEGLIGENCE AND WILLFUL MISCONDUCT, SHOULD THERE ARISE ANY LIABILITY ON THE PART OF TKS AS A RESULT OF TKS' BREACH OF THIS CONTRACT, NEGLIGENT PERFORMANCE TO ANY DEGREE OR NEGLIGENT FAILURE TO PERFORM ANY OF TKS' OBLIGATIONS PURSUANT TO THIS AGREEMENT OR ANY OTHER LEGAL DUTY, EQUIPMENT FAILURE, HUMAN ERROR, OR STRICT PRODUCTS LIABILITY, WHETHER ECONOMIC OR NON-ECONOMIC, IN CONTRACT OR IN TORT, THAT TKS' LIABILITY SHALL BE LIMITED TO THE SUM OF \$250,00 OR 6 TIMES THE MONTHLY PAYMENT FOR SERVICES BEING PROVIDED AT TIME OF LOSS, WHICHEVER IS GREATER. IF SUBSCRIBER WISHES TO INCREASE TKS' AMOUNT OF LIMITATION OF LIABILITY, SUBSCRIBER MAY, AS A MATTER OF RIGHT, AT ANY TIME, BY ENTERING INTO A SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT, OBTAIN A HIGHER LIMIT BY PAYING AN ANNUAL PAYMENT CONSONANT WITH TKS' INCREASED LIABILITY. THIS SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED AS INSURANCE COVERAGE AND NOTWITHSTANDING THE FOREGOING, TKS' LIABILITY SHALL NOT EXCEED ITS AVAILABLE INSURANCE COVERAGE.
- SUBSCRIBER ACKNOWLEDGES THAT THIS AGREEMENT CONTAINS EXCULPATORY CLAUSE, INDEMNITY, INSURANCE, ALLOCATION OF RISK AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY PROVISIONS.
- 24. LEGAL ACTION / BREACH / LIQUIDATED DAMAGES / AGREEMENT TO BINDING ARBITRATION: The parties agree that due to the nature of the services to be provided by TKS, the payments to be made by the Subscriber for the term of this agreement form an integral part of TKS' anticipated profits; that in the event of Subscriber's default it would be difficult if not impossible to fix TKS' actual damages. Therefore, in the event Subscriber defaults in any payment or charges to be paid to TKS, Subscriber shall be immediately liable for any unpaid installation and involced charges plus 80% of the balance of all payments for the entire term of this agreement as LIQUIDATED DAMAGES and TKS shall be permitted to terminate all its services, including but not limited to terminating monitoring service, under this agreement and to remotely reprogram or delete any programming without relieving Subscriber of any obligation herein.
- SUBSCRIBER ACKNOWLEDGES THAT THIS AGREEMENT CONTAINS A LIQUIDATED DAMAGE CLAUSE.
- The prevailing party in any litigation or arbitration is entitled to recover its legal fees from the other party. In any action commenced by TKS against Subscriber, Subscriber shall not be permitted to interpose any counterclaim. SUBSCRIBER MAY BRING CLAIMS AGAINST TKS ONLY IN SUBSCRIBER'S INDIVIDUAL CAPACITY, AND NOT AS A CLASS ACTION PLAINTIFF OR CLASS ACTION MEMBER IN ANY PURPORTED CLASS OR REPRESENTATIVE PROCEEDING. ANY DISPUTE BETWEEN THE PARTIES OR ARISING OUT OF THIS AGREEMENT, INCLUDING ISSUES OF ARBITRABILITY, SHALL, AT THE OPTION OF ANY PARTY, BE DETERMINED BY BINDING AND FINAL ARBITRATION BEFORE A SIGILE ARBITRATOR ADMINISTERED BY ARBITRATION SERVICES INC., ITS SUCCESSORS OR ASSIGNATION OF A REPORT OF THE PARTIES OR ARISINGATION ACT, EXCEPT THAT NO PUNITIVE OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES MAY BE AWARDED. The arbitrator shall be bound by the terms of this agreement, and shall on request of a party, conduct proceedings by telephone, video, submission of papers or in-person hearing. By agreeing to this arbitration provision the parties are waiving their right to a Irial before a judge or jury, waiving their right to appeal the arbitration award and waiving their right to participate in a class action. Service of process or



papers in any legal proceeding or arbitration between the parties may be made by First-Class Mail delivered by the U.S. Postal Service addressed to the party's address designated in this agreement, on file with an agency of the state, or any other address provided by the party in writing to the party making service. The parties submit to the jurisdiction and laws of Michigan, except for arbitration which is governed by the FAA and the arbitration rules and agree that any tiligation or arbitration between the parties shall be commenced and maintained in the county where TKS' principal place of business is located or Nassau County, New York. The parties waive trial by jury in any action between them unless prohibited by law. Any action between the parties must be commenced within one year of the accrual of the cause of action or shall be barred. All actions or proceedings by either party must be based on the provisions of this agreement. Any other action that Subscriber may have or bring against TKS in respect to other services rendered in connection with this agreement shall be deemed to have merged in and be restricted to the terms and conditions of this agreement.

SUBSCRIBER ACKNOWLEDGES THAT THIS AGREEMENT CONTAINS AN AGREEMENT TO ARBITRATE DISPUTES AND THAT ARBITRATION IS BINDING AND FINAL AND THAT SUBSCRIBER IS WAIVING SUBSCRIBER'S RIGHT TO TRIAL IN A COURT OF LAW AND OTHER RIGHTS.

25. TKS' RIGHT TO SUBCONTRACT SPECIAL SERVICES: Subscriber agrees that TKS is authorized and permitted to subcontract any services to be provided by TKS to third parties who may be independent of TKS, and that TKS shall not be liable for any loss or damage sustained by Subscriber by reason of fire, theft, burglary or any other cause whatsoever caused by the negligence of third parties, Subscriber appoints TKS to act as Subscriber's agent with respect to such third parties, except that TKS shall not obligate Subscriber to make any payments to such third parties. Subscriber acknowledges that this agreement, and particularly those paragraphs relating to TKS' disclaimer of warranties, exemption from liability, even for its negligence, limitation of liability and indemnification, inure to the benefit of and are applicable to any assignees, subcontractors, manufacturers, vendors and Monitoring Center of TKS.

26. MOLD, OBSTACLES AND HAZARDOUS CONDITIONS: Subscriber shall notify TKS in writing of any undisclosed, concealed or hidden conditions in any area where installation is planned, and Subscriber shall be responsible for removal of such conditions. In the event TKS discovers the presence of suspected asbestos or other hazardous material, TKS shall stop all work immediately and notify Subscriber. It shall be Subscriber's sole obligation to remove such conditions from the premises, and if the work is delayed due to the discovery of suspected asbestos or other hazardous material or conditions then an extension of time to perform the work shall be allowed and Subscriber agrees to compensate TKS for any additional expenses caused by the delay but not less than \$1000.00 per day until work can resume. If TKS, in its sole discretion, determines that continuing the work poses a risk to TKS or its employees or agents, TKS may elect to terminate this agreement on 3 day notice to Subscriber and Subscriber shall compensate TKS for all services rendered and material provided to date of termination. TKS shall be entitled to remove all its equipment and uninstalled equipment and material from the job site. Under no circumstances shall TKS be liable to Subscriber for any damage caused by mold or hazardous conditions or remediation thereof.

27. NON-SOLICITATION: Subscriber agrees that it will not solicit for employment for itself, or any other entity, or employ, in any capacity, any employee of TKS assigned by TKS to perform any service for or on behalf of Subscriber for a period of two years after TKS has completed providing service to Subscriber. In the event of Subscriber's violation of this provision, in addition to injunctive relief, TKS shall recover from Subscriber an amount equal to such employee's salary based on the average three months preceding employee's termination of employment with TKS, times twelve, together with TKS' counsel and expert witness fees.

28. FALSE ALARMS / PERMIT FEES / WITNESS FEES: Subscriber is responsible for all alarm permits and fees, agrees to file for and maintain any permits required by applicable law and indemnify or reimburse TKS for any fees or fines relating to permits or false alarms. TKS shall have no liability for permit fees, false alarms, false alarm fines, the manner in which police or fire department responds, or the refusal of the police or fire department to respond. In the event of termination of police or fire department response this agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and Subscriber shall remain liable for all payments provided for herein. In the event Subscriber or any third party subpoenas or summons TKS requiring any services or appearances, Subscriber agrees to pay TKS \$160 per hour for such services and appearances. Subscriber shall reimburse TKS for any Monitoring Center charges for excessive, run-a-way or false alarm signals.

29. SECURITY INTEREST / COLLATERAL: To secure Subscriber's obligations under this agreement Subscriber grants TKS a security interest in the security equipment installed by TKS and TKS is authorized to file a financing statement.

30. CREDIT INVESTIGATION: Subscriber and any guarantor authorize TKS to conduct credit investigations from time to determine Subscriber's and guarantor's credit worthiness.

31. FULL AGREEMENT / SEVERABILITY: This agreement along with the Schedule of Equipment and Services constitute the full understanding of the parties and may not be amended, modified or canceled, except in writing signed by both parties. Subscriber acknowledges and represents that Subscriber has not relied on any representation, assertion, guarantee, warranty, collateral agreement or other assurance, except those set forth in this Agreement. Subscriber hereby waives all rights and remedies, at law or in equity, arising, or which may arise, as the result of Subscriber before on such representation, assertion, assertion, warranty, collateral agreement or other assurance. To the extent this agreement is inconsistent with any other document or agreement, whether executed prior to, concurrently with or subsequent to this agreement shall govern. This agreement shall run concurrently with and shall not terminate or supersede any existing agreement between the parties unless specified herein. Should any provision of this agreement be deemed vold, the remaining parts shall be enforceable.
